




Santa Ana, CA (October 12, 2023) The Orange County Human Relations Commission celebrates Pride month with our Orange County LGBTQ+ community in June and stands with the LGBTQ+ community every other month of the year. We believe this vibrant and inclusive movement is to be commended. With each passing year, we are reminded that we still have work to do to ensure that every Orange County resident can live authentically and without threat of harm.

Across Orange County, from 2021 to 2022, there was a 126% increase in Anti-LGBTQ hate activity reported. In addition, hate crimes motivated by sexual orientation increased by 24% and hate incidents motivated by sexual orientation increased by 161%.

We believe in everyone's right to live free of racism, hate, discrimination, and bigotry no matter where theyyou live. OC HUMAN RELATIONS COMMISSION MOURNS WITH JEWISH **COMMUNITY AND DENOUNCES ANTISEMITISM**

Santa Ana, CA (11/9/23) The Orange County Human Relations Commission unequivocally condemns and denounces the horrific acts of terror including murder, rape, and kidnapping committed against Israeli civilians on October 7, 2023 by Hamas. Entire families were taken hostage by Hamas just days after Israel marked the holiest days on the Jewish calendar, murderingkilling 1400 human beings.

This single greatest attack on Jews since the Holocaust came just after this commission's 2022 Orange County Hate Crime Report revealed that Jewish residents of Orange County continue to be the primary target of faith-based hate incidents (87%). This hateful attack sparked a dramatic increase in antisemitism in the United States, resulting in our Orange County Jewish community experiencing harassment and fear of violence where they live, work, pray, and go to school. As Elie Wiesel said, "For the dead and the living, we must bear witness."

We offer our deepest sympathies and condolences to the Jewish community who have been affected by the horrendous events of October 7th. We are resolute and unwavering in our stance against hate, and we stand committed to fighting antisemitism in Orange County. We urge all Orange County residents to treat our Jewish neighbors with respect and continue to hope for an Orange County where fear and violence yield to understanding and coexistence for all its residents.

Santa Ana, CA (11/9/23) The Palestinian struggle for land and home is generations-long. Now as a result of the Israeli response to Hamas' terrorist attack, After the events on October 7th, more than one million Palestinians have been displaced, and an additional two million are expected to be displaced and their homes destroyed with nowhere to go and limited humanitarian aid. Thousands of Palestinians Muslims and Christians have been massacred, nearly half children. They have taken their last breath under concrete rubble, and many more are still longing to breathe free. We mourn the loss of these innocent Palestinian lives.
